NB: Any consultation should not delay a referral. In an emergency, dial 999



Step 1

If you are worried that an Adult at Risk of Harm is being abused:

e.g

- · You have seen something.
- · An Adult at Risk of Harm says they have been abused.
- · Somebody else has told you they are concerned.
- · There has been an allegation against a member of staff.
- · There has been an anonymous allegation.
- · Someone has disclosed they were abusing an Adult at Risk of Harm.

Definition

SUFFOL

An Adult at risk of Harm is someone who is:

- Is aged 18 years and over.
- Is at risk of, or is currently experiencing abuse.
- Has care and support needs.
- Is unable to protect themselves from harm due to their care and support needs.

(Examples of care and support needs are:

physical disability, learning disability, mental health needs, physical health needs, long or short term illness, alcohol or substances misuse/dependence, elderly frail.)
